

#### **IT'S ABOUT TIME!**

The time has come,' the Walrus said,
To talk of many things:
Of shoes — and ships — and sealing-wax —
Of cabbages — and kings —
And why the sea is boiling hot —
And whether pigs have wings.'

Lewis Carroll's *The Walrus and the Carpenter* was one of my favorites as a child (before I started reading literary critics' attempts to find symbolism where it may not exist in the overall story line). For me, this stanza is an invitation to communicate about anything and everything that interests or concerns us. What better time is there than the beginning of a new year under new leadership? A whole new world of possibilities lays at our feet. I hope you feel as energized as I do, as we anticipate the official arrival of our new Priest -in-Charge, the Rev. Douglas Hale, on January 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### The Care and Feeding of a Pastor

We have proven ourselves to be fairly self-sufficient over the past couple years, so we should be able to give Fr. Hale a little time to settle in and get to know us better before we rush him with all our personal concerns. (I'm not saying we shouldn't raise topics right away, just that we shouldn't expect him to address them all at once.)

It has been a long while since we've had a priest-in-charge capable of leading us in the sacraments of the church, guiding our hearts and minds toward a deeper faith in God, and comforting us in our personal tribulations. We should all keep in mind that our new priest was <u>not</u> called to be a full time pastor of our little flock. I ask you to be mindful of his scheduled time with us (which he will announce), and for his need for personal time. Why? Because I have no desire to engage in another search process anytime soon.

A couple weeks ago, *CBS This Morning* aired a segment about church pastors experiencing burnout. They interviewed the Rev. Howard-John Wesley, Pastor of Alfred Street Baptist Church in Alexandria, VA (a mega church with 10,000 members and an army of ministers to share the load). Pastor Wesley explained that being on call 24/7 for 21 years has taken its toll, and he plans to take a three and a half month sabbatical to concentrate on his own well-being: getting more exercise, eating better, and tending to his personal need for time with God. The segment included the results of a survey of 1,500 clergy, of whom 54% found their pastoral duties overwhelming, 33% felt isolated, and 71% served churches that made no provision for clergy to take sabbaticals.

#### Bring Your Imagination

After church on January 26<sup>th</sup>, we'll hold our Annual Meeting to review how well we worked together in 2019; to elect representatives to the BAC and Diocesan Convention; and to look forward to how we will express our mission to love God, love our Neighbor, and serve one another in 2020. It's time for new ideas, new efforts and new energy. Please be there to lend your voice to the discussion.

#### **Canonical Offerings**

Three times a year, each church in the Diocese of Oregon makes a special offering to the diocese as required by Canon 5.4. Generally, the "loose offering" (cash) in the collection plate on that day is used for these purposes (however checks are also acceptable if they are clearly designated for the particular canonical offering in the "Memo" section of the check).

**Theological Education Offering**: On the Sunday closest to January 25 (the Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle) a special collection is taken in support of theological education. This year the offering will be taken on **January 26**<sup>th</sup>. The offering is transmitted to the Treasurer of the Diocese, to be forwarded to the seminary designated by the Priest in Charge of the parish or mission.

Pentecost Offering: This year, Pentecost (the "birthday of the church") falls on May 31<sup>st</sup>. The collection on this day funds a variety of ministries within the Diocese through special grants.

**Thanksgiving Offering**: Some Episcopal churches hold services on Thanksgiving Day. Ours generally does not. So, on a **Sunday in November** (to be determined by the BAC) a special collection is taken and transmitted to the Commission on Poverty and Homelessness unless otherwise designated by Diocesan Council.

(A fourth canonical obligation to the Diocese occurs biennially, during the Bishop's official visitation, payable to the **Bishop's Discretionary Fund** in aid of seminarians and other emergency needs. Bishop Michael is scheduled to visit St. John's **April 19**<sup>th</sup>, the Sunday after Easter.)
