

Fr. Doug's Iconic Column

This past month we have passed the mark of 500,000 deaths due to the COVID-19 virus and this month we will pass the 1-year mark of discontinuing in-person worship at St. John. The number of deaths far exceeds the early predictions and the year long absence far exceeds what we had hoped would be a few months of inconvenience.

With a number of us receiving one of the vaccines, we have a new hope that we can make a move toward, if not totally back, to normalcy. There is also the encouraging note that while Coos County continues to be in the Extreme Risk level, the Bandon area is significantly below the levels of cases identified in Coos Bay/North Bend and Coquille is somewhere in between.

We would love to return to in-person worship in the sanctuary, but the air circulation in that room is not all that good. We have done some looking into how to improve the circulation, whether we can better filter the air, but that approach has not been very promising. One idea is to have more than one service each Sunday so that even greater distances between people attending could be maintained.

When the weather improves, we could try doing outdoor gatherings, but that is so dependent upon the weather behaving. So another proposal has arisen of using Theresa Hall for worship. This would involve opening the windows to provide good air circulation. People would need to dress warmly, but at least we would be out of the rain and would not experience the full force of the winds. We would have to institute a practice of thoroughly cleaning of the hall and bathrooms because of the continued us of the hall by three different AA groups during the week.

We also need to realize that some of us have preexisting conditions that make some of us more vulnerable to the virus. And some, because of their youth, may not have received the vaccine. So, there is a recognition that not everyone may feel safe enough to return. So we will continue to offer worship online.

Whatever way we choose, we would still require the wearing of masks and keeping 6 feet apart. There would be no singing and we would be limited to receiving only the bread for communion. We will have a thorough discussion of these approaches at the BAC meeting on March 9th. (Continued on page 2)

As I right this I feel like I am not saying anything new. What I wish I could say is that the crisis is over, and we can now go back to normal. But what we are left with at this time is trying to find some way to reclaim at least part of our life together.
