#### Bishop's Advisory Committee Notes - March 2022

Here's what took place at the March BAC meeting

#### We Reviewed

February's financial report.

The new Covenant of Ministry that pertains to Fr. Doug's transition from Priest-in-Charge to Vicar.

#### We Discussed

The completed installation a new Sentinel-One antivirus software subscription by Bandon IT.

The changing State of Oregon COVID protocols and how we can return to some semblance of "normal".

The sad passing of Grant Webb on March 6th and how the church can respond.

The visit of Bishop Diana on March 27<sup>th</sup> and how to prepare for the Celebration of Ministry service and the confirmation of Jennifer Mello, and the reception to follow.

#### We Learned

That Fr. Doug is now coordinating the City Council invocation schedule and gave the invocation at the last City Council meeting.

#### **We Admired**

The myrtlewood cross that Tom Glunt has created and that will be presented to Bishop Diana when she visits St. John's.

#### Fr. Doug's Iconic Column

There is much that is vying for my attention these days. With the break we are getting from extremely limiting COVID protocols, we can get back some semblance of normal worship and we can plan a fairly full Holy Week Schedule (see below). It also brings us back to the need for many people to be willing to help make our gathering together happen (see below below). I hope you will prayerfully consider how you will participate this month in worship, fellowship and service to one another.

#### **HOLY WEEK – APRIL 10-17**

After at least two years of very minimal celebrating of Holy Week, we are looking forward to a somewhat normal week this year.

**Palm Sunday** (April 10) will begin in Theresa Hall, where we will begin the Liturgy of the Palms and then process into the sanctuary. There we will hear the Word of God including the reading of the Luke's Passion Narrative beginning with the Last Supper, followed by Communion.

A **Maundy Thursday** Service will be held on April 14 at 5:30pm in the sanctuary. We will hear John's recounting of Jesus washing his disciples' feet followed by our washing of one another's feet. It then concludes with Communion and then the Stripping of the Altar.

We will then gather for **Good Friday** on April 15 at 5:30pm. This is a solemn service, begun in silence. It includes the reading of John's Passion Narrative and prayers for the world, both near and far. It concludes with the Veneration of the Cross and then silence. People will be invited to stay for silent prayer as long as they wish.

There will be no **Stations of the Cross** service this year, but you are invited to come by the church and use one of the booklets to walk the Stations of the Cross in the sanctuary, or you can watch the already recorded Stations of the Cross on our YouTube Channel or our Facebook page. Any time between now and Easter morning would be an appropriate time to follow the Way of the Cross.

**Easter** finally arrives on Sunday April 17. We hope that day to pull out all the stops to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

One of the wonderful things about Episcopal worship is that it is not a one-man or one-woman show. Worship is the gathering of the people and actively participating and contributing to the worship of God. While we all raise our voices to contribute to the worship, there are some who help in specific ways. We are especially wanting to encourage people to volunteer to be a **Lector**, who reads the scripture lessons, to be an **Intercessor**, leading the prayers of the people, or an **Usher**, who shows hospitality to people, especially visitors, as they arrive for worship and receive the people's offerings. If you look above at the worship schedule for Holy Week, you can see that our need for people to help out is greater than usual.

We also need people willing to make **Coffee Hour** happen. Ginger is presently soliciting people to sign up. The signup sheet will be available this Sunday during Coffee Hour. Please join in to make our gathering in worship and fellowship a special time.

In addition, we desperately need someone to be the Clerk for the Bishop's Advisory Committee (BAC). Essentially,

this person takes notes at our meetings, writes up a clear set of minutes of the meeting and gets them approved by the BAC. I will personally help our new Clerk to understand how best to do this so that it is not an overwhelming task. The Clerk is not automatically a voting member of the BAC, but certainly can be a part of the discussions and express opinions.

#### From the Senior Warden

We have just celebrated three important events at St. John.

**ONE:** Jennifer Mello was presented for Confirmation. Congratulations, Jennifer!

<u>Confirmation Defined</u>. Confirmation is the sacramental rite in which the candidate expresses a mature commitment to Christ, and receives strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop.

TWO: The hands that were laid upon Jennifer were the hands of Bishop Diana who visited St. John's. She preached, confirmed Jennifer, presided at Eucharist, and examined our parochial records. She took a look into the Medical Loan Closet and enjoyed fellowship with us in Theresa Hall. Thank you for your visit, Bishop!

<u>Bishop Defined</u>. One of the three orders of ordained ministers in the church, bishops are charged with the apostolic work of leading, supervising, and uniting the church. Bishops represent Christ and his church, and they are called to provide Christian vision and leadership for their dioceses.

**THREE:** Also during her visit, the Bishop installed Fr. Doug as our Vicar in a Celebration of a New Ministry. Fr. Doug was first called to St. John as our Priest-in-Charge but changing his title to Vicar indicates our commitment to a more permanent position. We are so lucky to have you, Fr. Doug!

<u>Celebration of a New Ministry Defined.</u> The form for the institution or induction of a priest as the rector of a parish. It may be used for the installation of deans and canons of cathedrals, or the induction of other diocesan or parochial ministries, including assistant ministers and vicars of missions.

<u>Vicar Defined</u>. In the Episcopal Church, the title generally applies to the priest in charge of a mission congregation. The diocesan bishop is the rector, and the priest representing the bishop is the vicar. <u>est Defined</u>. "Priest" is derived from the Greek presbyteros meaning "elder, or "old man". (Strike through edit by Judy.)

<u>Gratitude Defined</u>. A strong feeling of appreciation to someone or something for what the person has done to help you. (The Cambridge Dictionary)

Fr. Doug Hale has unified us, kept us going through a pandemic, and shown great patience and compassion. St. John's is experiencing new stability even in the face of hard times. This wouldn't be happening without Fr. Doug's efforts. Thank you, Fr. Doug, for all that you've done and will do for St. John's. Thank you for caring for the people of St. John.
